Stockpiling is always around us. We pile stuff to make our habitat, our world. We create sets, orders and disorders. We make almost comprehensible machines even though we know nothing about mechanics or science.

The mental processes on which we build our configurations of the world are produced by the invisible movements that cross them and in most of the cases, overflow them. Cosmos, chaos and order at the same time. We are ultimately unable to identify the borders of each. One world awake and another one asleep at the same time. "Life isn't a personal matter; it depends on foreign movements that overtake us. While one is going around doing stuff, there is a world that works in silence. We play alone as a monological and cosmological practice, that in many cases is nothing but a set of innumerable acts of faith and complicity, of course. Actions that despite their supposed absence allow us to find the "state of things" that shapes the universe. We ignore. Because we can not stand with our eyes open all day, because others can not stand looking day and night either, like those that remain awake... everything provides a diverse and unique spectacle without an spectator. And so, the world just happens. Art is also a call, it is being alert most of the time, even if that means waiting for deception, and loss."

She holds a BA in Arts from the National School of Painting, Sculpture and Engraving "La Esmeralda" (INBA, Mexico City); is technician in Photography from UNAM (Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México), and an exchange student in the Fine Arts program at the Statliche der Bilbenden Kunste Karlsruhe, Germany. Her work has been exhibited in renowned international institutions, including The National Museum Centro de Arte Reina Sofia in Spain; MALBA, Buenos Aires; Museo Ex Teresa Arte Actual, Mexico, among others. She has won prestigious awards from institutions such as a FONCA award for a residence at Banff Centre in Canada, the Young Artists FONCA scholarship, the scholarship for International Studies from The Jumex Collection, Mexico; and a scholarship from the Kunst Akademie in Karlsruhe, Germanu.

Her body of work is part of collections such as the Progressive Art Collection, USA; The Jumex Museum Collection, Mexico; The Maraloto Collection, Colombia; among others.

She currently lives and works in Mexico City.
